The completion of his research at Georgetown University on Latino voters became the basis for his pioneering work on Latino communications and outreach strategies in California, Texas, Florida and nationwide. He has served as the press secretary for the California Assembly Republican Leader and as the political director for the California Republican Party. In 2001 he was named as one of America's "Most Influential Hispanics" by Hispanic Business Magazine and is a regular commentator on Latino political issues in statewide and national media publications. She's a senior reporter on immigration and politics and a regular commentator for radio and television in both Spanish and English media. Her coverage of Latino community issues and challenges has won awards and fellowships from New America Media, the New School, and the International Center for Journalists. Marrero also authored El Despertar del Sueño Americano, published by Penguin Books; the English version of the book, Killing the American Dream, was recently published by Palgrave McMillan.
